The author is a Haitian-born writer and spoken word artist who lives in Delray Beach. Flose took a leap of faith when she was 24-years-old and self-published her book of poetry. Within six months, she sold more than 1,000 copies, which gave her the opportunity to travel and perform.

Flose works at Space of Mind, an alternative schoolhouse, where she teaches humanities with a focus on government. In addition, she was recently named one of BET's 8 Millennial Feminist Poets That Deserve Recognition. According to Flose, she recalls picking up a pen to write her first poem in third grade, and hasn't stopped writing since.
