Dressed in dense white mist she blankets and caresses everything peacefully beneath her soft touch.


Tantalizing with a soft moist kiss she seductively lures you to her lover death.


Upon returning home, I read the letter to my mom and nearly flipped out. "He must be kidding?" I shouted in disbelief.
